
Spring 2026 Honors-Quality Course Offerings:

All the following courses are considered honors-quality. If you plan to use one of the classes as honors disciplinary breadth, please check the honors disciplinary breadth document to find which category a class will fulfill and check with your honors advisor.

GE FOUNDATIONS

All students must complete the GE Foundations, with one class per category. Cross-listed classes could count in any category for which they are approved, but each class can only be used once. Foundation classes may not overlap with majors, but can overlap with minors. Honors students are encouraged to complete honors-quality Foundations when appropriate, but there are no honors requirements for the Foundations.



Mathematical and Quantitative Reasoning, 5-8 hours

The goal of courses in this category is to help students apply quantitative or logical reasoning and/or mathematical/statistical methods to understand and solve problems and communicate their results.

If you need a class to fulfill this requirement, please talk with your Honors advisor, as your major requirements should always take precedence.

Writing and Information Literacy, 3 hours

The goals of courses in this category is to develop students' skills in effective reading and writing as well as in oral, digital and/or visual communication for a range of purposes, audiences and context.

There are no honors quality WIL classes offered in Spring 2026. However, if you have not yet fulfilled this requirement, we highly recommend that you do so as soon as possible.

Literary, Visual, and Performing Arts, 3 hours

The goal of courses in this category is to help students analyze, interpret, and evaluate major forms of human thought, cultures, and expression; to demonstrate capacities for aesthetic and culturally informed understanding; and to experience the arts and reflect on that experience critically and creatively

Historical and Cultural Studies, 3 hours

The goal of courses in Historical Studies is to help students investigate and analyze, critically, historical ideas, events, persons, material culture, and artifacts to understand how they shape society and people. The goal of courses in Cultural Studies is to help students evaluate significant cultural phenomena and ideas to develop capacities for aesthetic and cultural response, judgment, interpretation, and evaluation.

Natural Sciences, 4-5 hours

The goal of courses in the category is to engage students in theoretical and empirical study within the natural sciences, to help students gain an appreciation of the modern principles, theories, methods, and modes of inquiry used generally across the natural sciences, and to help students discern the relationship between the theoretical and applied sciences while appreciating the implications of scientific discoveries and the potential impacts of science and technology.

Many of the Natural Sciences GE classes are considered Honors-quality, but also have significant prerequisites. The classes listed here are intentionally chosen for Honors students who do not have specific science requirements associated with their majors.

The goal of courses in this category is to engage students in a systematic assessment of how historically and socially constructed categories of race, ethnicity, and gender, and possibly others, shape perceptions, individual outcomes, and broader societal, political, economic and cultural systems and to empower students to recognize and compare a range of lived experiences of race, gender and ethnicity.
